I hope that this online event shall allow you to synergize with one another in the pursuit of MetCJAP's mission of "enhancing the Rule of Law in the context of a sound administration of justice". My warmest regards to all of you, and as the Supreme Court En Banc gives its full support to all magistrates, officials, and staff of the Philippine Judiciary, I trust in your full support as well as we forge our way ahead towards the new normal.

METCJAP 2019-2021 Board's Report

Petronila P. TaÑas-Arguelles VP for Luzon

Unabashedly, the current board is the most dynamic and most adaptive Board that MetCJAP has ever had. Before rolling those eyes, Your Honors, the following are the reasons for claiming so.

First, we have seen the promotion of eight members of the Board of Trustees as RTC judges namely: Judge Joel Vercide, Trustee for Mindanao; our past president Judge Leilani Marie Dacanay-Grimares, Judges Sheryl Dolendo Tulabing, Belen Salespara-Carasig, Ma. Christina De Pio Lim, and Bernard Bernal, all Trustees for the NCJR; Judge Zarah Sanchez-Fernandez, Trustee for Luzon; and our outgoing president, Judge Anne Beatrice G. Aguana-Balmaceda, Trustee for Visayas. Likewise, our Trustee for Mindanao, Judge Norma Calatrava, retired from the judiciary after more than 15 years of service. In accordance with our By-Laws, the Board appointed judges from the regions where the respective vacancies occurred with our colleagues who are willing to serve MetCJAP especially during these challenging times.

We welcomed as members of the Board of Trustees the following: Judges Cristina Haw Tay-Jovero and Marie Estrellita Tolentino-Rojas, Trustees for Mindanao; Judges Ma. Victoria Padilla, Karen Canullas-Armada, and Katlyn Anne Aguilar-Bilgera as Trustees for NCJR; and our Past President, Judge Cesar Merlas, as Officer-at-Large.

Second, this Board, which we named in our messenger group chat as **Covid Board,** is one with the world in adapting to a seemingly insurmountable plague that has been beleaguering us for more than a year, the COVID-19. Our meetings were conducted via video conferences, updates were done through social media groups, while those tasks that demand physical presence despite the travel restrictions, health protocols, and safety concerns were performed by the selected members of the Board to fulfil our obligation to the association and to you, Your Honors.

Allow us to walk you through what the MetCJAP Board 2019-2021 has been doing.

The Board worked for and delivered excellent conventions, not only in terms of the most opportune topics in this noble profession discussed by our legal luminaries, but also the string of exciting activities that would sustain Your Honors' interests. Themed fellowship nights and amazing eco-tours that followed were results of months-long planning, focusing on the members' comfort and convenience, and the indefatigable spirits of the convention directors and hosts who went their extra mile in requesting assistance from their Local Government Units in order to stage a meaningful gathering of the country's metropolitan and city judges. These annual conventions are generally organized not only for our continuing legal education, but moreso as a welcome respite from the intense atmosphere in our courtrooms.

The daunting task of the MetCJAP Board 2019-2021 is to give you, Your Honors, a convention experience better than the previous. Our Dumaguete City Convention on September 11 to 13, 2019 reigns supreme for two years now—spearheaded by the energetic Judge Bernal, together with the invaluable support of our co-convention directors, Judges Dinah Tabada Chu and Coy Calimbayan Gadugdug. The decorations that adorned the lobby of Bravo Hotel in the town of Sibulan, and the mouth-watering native delicacies were punctuated by themed fellowship nights. It was here that the present Board of Trustees was elected and took their oath of office before then Chief Justice Lucas Bersamin. Past President Grimares, who had spiralled the association into greater heights during her incumbency, turned over the "key" of MetcJAP to Judge Anne Beatrice Aguana-Balmaceda, who was likewise crowned Best in Latin Costume that night together with now retired Judge Alexis Zerrudo, both of MTCC Iloilo City.





Mayor Felipe Antonio Remollo had us taste the hospitality of the City of the Gentle People when he accommodated us in his home during the Luau-themed party, a spectacular evening despite the heavy rains.



Literally right after the convention, President Balmaceda, Past President Grimares, Liaison Officer for International Affairs Belen Salespara-Carasig, Liaison Officer for the Supreme Court Christina De Pio Lim, Executive Vice President Sheryll Dolendo Tulabing and former Trustee Maria Clarita Tabin prepared for their flight to attend the 62nd Annual Meeting of the International Association of Judges (IAJ) held in Nur-Sultan (Astana) on September 15-19, as representatives of the association.

The IAJ was founded in Salzburg (Austria) in 1953 with headquarters in Rome. It is a professional, non-political, international organization, bringing together national associations of judges, not individual judges, and with members coming from 92 countries. Its aim is to safeguard the independence of the judiciary, guaranteeing human rights and freedom. IAJ organizes annual conferences of study groups, serves as an avenue to discuss urgent problems and effective solutions, and strengthens professional contacts. MetCJAP has been applying for membership in this prestigious international organization and has been invited as an Observer together with Gabon, Yemen, New Zealand and Lebanon. MetCJAP thru Judges Carasig, Treasurer Remie Mondia, and VP for Mindanao Eileen Pakino-Bonghanoy attended webinars conducted by the IAJ.



After being subjected to the tedious process of review of our judicial system, on 11 September 2021, the present members of the IAJ have found the Philippines qualified to become a member of such a prestigious organization.



On October 15, 2019, Judges Petronila Tañas-Arguelles, Rean Arizala-Joaquin, and Christina Lim handed the association's token to CJ Bersamin during the Testimonial Program in his honor in the Supreme Court grounds.

On November 21-22, 2019, the Board travelled to Angeles City, and Clarkfield,

Pampanga, the first considered choice for the holding of our 2020 Convention. The Board was welcomed by Angeles City Mayor Carmelo Lazatin, Jr. and Congressman Carmelo Lazatin II who expressed their enthusiasm in hosting our convention. The Board conducted an ocular inspection of the possible convention halls, hotel accommodations and tourism landmarks. On the second day, the group met with Clark Development Corporation President and CEO Noel Manankil who likewise extended their commitment to partner with the LGUs in receiving metropolitan and city judges in the Philippines come September.









On November 26, 2019, MetCJAP had signed its fifth Memorandum of Agreement with the Philippine Chinese Charitable Association, Inc. (PCCAI). This partnership started in 2010 wherein Your Honors can avail of a 50% discount on certain medical and hospital expenses at the Chinese General Hospital and Medical Center. Present in this event were Dr. James Dy, President of PCCAI, and other officers, while our association was represented by our President together with Judges Carasig, Tulabing, Lim, VP for NCJR Don Ace Alagar and Asst. Documentation Officer Mederlyn Magalindan.



The advent of the coronavirus pandemic had shocked the country in 2020. Then known as the NCov, there were information that Clark Freeport and Special Economic Zone, Pampanga, was being considered as one of the quarantine facilities. To allay fears from the delegates, the Board resolved to change the venue of the 2020 Convention. In the 1st Quarterly Meeting (QM) of the Board on February 24, 2020 in Davao City, it was unanimously approved that Cagayan De Oro City, Northern Mindanao would be the site of our next convention, with the theme: "Judicial **Education and Training: MetCJAP and** the Court's Ten-Point Agenda" taking into account then Chief Justice Diosdado Peralta's programs.

In that QM, the following were also tackled: **1.** SC- Computerization and Library, **2.** Health Care Service Provider, **3.** MetCJAP Newsletter, **4.** SEC registration on the amended By-laws, and **5.** Committee on Security congressional hearings. More importantly, **Resolution 2020-02** was approved giving financial assistance in case of illness, physical disability or death in the amount of ₱20,000.00 for incumbent members, and ₱10,000.00 for retired members.





A Testimonial Dinner for CJ Peralta in Rizal Hotel, Manila was likewise finalized. But due to the pandemic, this did not push through. In its stead, Judge Mondia, amidst the restrictions and protocols, bravely represented MetCJAP in handing our token to the Chief Justice on March 24, 2021. Likewise, a video presentation tribute was prepared by Judge Jarley Sulay and posted on the MetCJAP website.



Judges Alagar, Mondia and Anne Rivera-Sia, PRO, who were actively representing MetCJAP in committee hearings before the House of representatives and the Senate reported that MetCJAP is: 1) pushing for the inclusion of hazard pay for the first level court judges in the annual GAA; 2) requesting for the increase in the number of court staff via permanent appointment of Court Decongestion Officers and additional process servers; 3) attending congressional hearings on the increase in the jurisdictional amount of the first level courts in civil cases; 4) supporting the creation of Judiciary Marshals concerning threats peculiar to members of the judiciary.





The Philippine Judiciary Bill authored by Congressman Ruffy Biazon was approved by Lower House on June 2, 2021. Reliance on other government agencies on security matters will be minimized as the Judiciary will have its own force to protect persons, property, court proceedings and counter threats. Further, as we are aware Your Honors, President Rodrigo Roa Duterte has signed into law R.A. 11576 expanding the jurisdiction of the first level courts. We need to roll up our sleeves a bit higher as the threshold amount for civil actions involving real property is up to ₱400,000.00; while other civil actions, probate proceedings, admiralty and maritime actions where the demand or claim does not exceed ₱2M is now within our exclusive jurisdiction.

Refreshing our memory, on March 9, 2020, Pres. Duterte issued Proclamation No. 922, declaring the country under **a state of public health emergency.** On March 16, the entire Luzon was placed under an "Enhanced Community Quarantine" (ECQ). The Supreme Court, for the first time in history, has declared the physical closure of all courts nationwide.

On April 13, 2020, with the appointment of Chief Justice Alexander Gesmundo at the helm, the first-ever virtual Town Hall Meeting with the Chief Justice and the Associate Justices of the Supreme Court with about 2000 judges in the Philippines was held using the live event feature of the Judiciary 365 platform. CJ Gesmundo



assures to actively look into the pressing concerns brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic. Immediately, the grant of communication allowance for internet connectivity, and permission for judges to hold hearing *via* videoconferencing anywhere they may be in the Philippines, among others, were approved.



Thus, the 2nd QM set on April 16 and 17, 2020 in CDO for the usual ocular inspection and event planning did not materialize. However, the Board's commitment the association remains unwavering. Travel restrictions, quarantine classifications, health protocols relegated our much-awaited physical congregation into on-line an meeting via Zoom. With primordial consideration for the health and safety of the members of the Association, with various places under ECQ/GCQ, the Board unanimously voted to cancel last year's convention. In its stead, the

Board brainstormed on web-based seminars relevant to the revolutionary change on the conduct of court hearings, best court practices amidst COVID-19, and other topics tailored-fit for the judges were done. Further, members of the Board distributed "care packages" composed of mask, face shield, alcohol to members.

Hence, on June 12, 2020, the Board had called on a special meeting via Zoom to iron out the last webinar that details of the afternoon. Spearheaded by Judge Jeland Omer L. Pomentilla, Asst. Secretary-General for NCJR, and Judge Sia, we launched a Webinar on Biosafety: Covid and the Courts via Microsoft Teams. The Supreme Court readily allowed the association to use the latter App as the platform for the conference. Considering then that the App has a limit of 250 persons, for maximum sharing of much needed information, the Board shared the webinar via FB livestream. In connection with this, the IBP-Quezon City Chapter, headed by its President, Atty. Donna Alagar, had partnered with MetCJAP to bring the topic on Biosafety to a larger audience on June 25, 2020 via Zoom.



The year 2021 ushered the Board to a series monthly/bimonthly meetings in preparation for the September blended virtual convention. Discussion on provisions, themes, topics, registration, information dissemination, invitation; creation of committees; coordination with PHILJA, resource persons, and guests; and finalization of program flow, physical and technical arrangements, among other things. This is in addition to the almost daily updates, and consultations done by the Board through FB messenger group chat.









As was with all our previous conventions, the Board conducts an Outreach Program in the host city. Considering that for the first time we are conducting our gathering virtually, the Board through Judge Tulabing, her staff, and the BJMP of Malabon represented MetCJAP in this year's Outreach Program at Hospicio de San Jose, Manila.

To the more than 300 members of MetCJAP, Your Honors, we are humbly endorsing to you the MetCJAP Board 2019-2021's accomplishments. Thank you very much for your trust.
